Guelph-Wellington Women in Crisis (G-W WIC) is a dynamic, community-based, not for profit, feminist organization providing services to women and their children who have experienced domestic violence, sexual violence and human trafficking in Guelph and Wellington County.

If you are self-directed with the ability to work effectively within a team environment, are compassionate, creative and resourceful, please consider this opportunity.

Responsibilities include:

- Ensure leadership, project management, report writing and accountability on all public education projects.
- Coordinate and provide public education, trainings and workshops addressing sexual, domestic, human trafficking and gendered violence.
- Develop curriculum related to preventing and responding to sexual assault, sexual exploitation, domestic violence and other forms of gendered violence.
- Provide all services and duties from an integrated anti-racist, feminist, and anti-oppression framework.
- In collaboration with the social media committee ensure a relevant on-line presence.
- Provide support to G-W WIC's volunteer program and volunteer training.
- Acts as an advocate and resource person for the agency on issues of gender-based violence and prevention education in the local community.
- Maintain records of all education and outreach activities, and submit reports and statistics as required.
- Act as an ambassador for our Centre with our community and partners.
- Respond to media requests.

The successful candidate will have:

- In-depth knowledge of the root causes of gender-based violence, & how it intersects with other systems of oppression.
- Strong understanding of best practices in educating towards social change.
- Experience managing volunteers, projects, and events.
- Skilled public speaker, including experience working with media.
- Experience with a broad range of social media platforms.
- Skilled writer.
- A minimum of 2 years' experience delivering education presentations with diverse communities.
- Computer proficiency & experience creating or manipulating images (Publisher, Canva, Photoshop etc.)
- A second language other than English and French is an asset; Bilingualism is an asset.
- Related post-secondary education.
- This position requires the successful candidate to have a valid driver's license, access to a vehicle, and a Vulnerable Sector Records Check. A flexible schedule is required for evening and weekend work.
