Guelph-Wellington Women in Crisis (G-W WIC) is a dynamic, community-based, not for profit, feminist organization providing services to women and their children who have experienced domestic violence, sexual violence and human trafficking in Guelph and Wellington County.

If you are self-directed with the ability to work effectively independently and within a team environment, are compassionate, creative and resourceful, please consider this opportunity.

This position requires the successful candidate to have a valid driver's license, access to a vehicle, and a Vulnerable Sector Records Check. A flexible schedule is required for evening and weekend work.

#### **Responsibilities include:**

- Provide leadership, project management, report writing and accountability on all public education projects.
- Provide public education, trainings & workshops on sexual, domestic, human trafficking and gendered violence.
- Develop curriculum related to preventing and responding to sexual assault, sexual exploitation, domestic violence and other forms of gendered violence.
- Provide all services and duties from an integrated anti-racist, feminist, and anti-oppression framework.
- In collaboration with the social media committee maintain G-W WIC's social media tools and website.
- Coordinate G-W WIC's social action and advocacy initiatives e.g. IWD, TBTN, December 6<sup>th</sup> etc.
- Provide support to G-W WIC's volunteer program and volunteer training.
- Act as an advocate, ambassador and resource person for the agency on issues of gender-based violence and prevention education in the Guelph-Wellington community.
- Maintain records of all education and outreach activities, and submit reports and statistics as required.
- Respond to media requests.

#### **Qualifications:**

- A minimum 2-years' experience outreaching & delivering education presentations with diverse communities.
- Related post-secondary education.
- In-depth knowledge of root causes of gender-based violence, and how it intersects with other systems of oppression.
- Strong understanding of best practices in educating towards social change.
- Experience managing volunteers, projects and events.
- Skilled public speaker, including experience working with media.
- Proficiency with a broad range of social media platforms.
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills.
- Knowledge of marketing, promotional materials, social and public relations.
- Computer proficiency and experience creating or manipulating images (e.g. Publisher, Canva, Photoshop etc.)
